Call to Order

A regular meeting called to order 2:04 by TAC Chair Weston Martin. There were no disclosures.

A. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

B. APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

Approval of Chatfield TAC March 1, 2022 Meeting Minutes

Motion to approve the Chatfield TAC March 1, 2022, Meeting Minutes as presented made by David Van Dellen and seconded by Carolyn Roan. Motion carried unanimously.

C. APPROVAL/RATIFICATION OF INVOICES

CWA made pledge of \$5,000 to River Network contingent on CWCB grant approval. CWA agreed to provide funding prior to River Network receiving CWCB funding to allow the project to launch. There was a request to include an explanation of the River Network invoice with the minutes of this meeting.



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Motion was made by David Van Dellen to approve RESPEC invoice #W0035 in the amount of \$5,265.85 and River Network invoice #2235 in the amount of \$5,000.00 and seconded by Ryan Adrian. Motion carried unanimously.

D. Presentation of the draft 2021 Chatfield WA Annual Report and recommendation for Board approval of Annual Report to be submitted to the Water Quality Control Commission.

The draft report was presented. New map graphics have been added. Phytoplankton concentration information has been added. Included a sampling and analysis Plan table. Three entities exceeded their wasteload allocations. RESPEC will be contacting those entities to verify that their numbers are correct. The Highlands Ranch Law Enforcement Academy has moved to a septic system permit. RESPEC will research the ramifications and whether the Academy should continue to have a wasteload allocation. There were requests that the report include other Nonpoint Source efforts that CWA is supporting financially including the West Plum Creek Stream Management Plan and the Hilldale Pines Fire Mitigation Project.

There was discussion on signage about trash along the riverbanks. Has CWA developed verbiage for trail systems highlighting trash and hillside disturbances? This may be a partnering opportunity on consistent messaging for signage. The major MS4 permit holders have developed a brand. It has been included in their signage and there are statewide efforts in place. Douglas County will get more information.

Motion made by David Van Dellen to recommend the Board approve the draft 2021 Chatfield WA Annual Report and include any minor additional changes and comments for submission to the Water Quality Control Commission and seconded by Carolyn Roan. Motion carried unanimously.

E. Presentation of the draft CWA website upgrade and recommend Board approval for CWA website to launch.

Motion made by Ryan Adrian to recommend CWA Board approve CWA Squarespace website launch and seconded by Patrick O'Connell. Motion carried unanimously.

DISCUSSION ITEMS (2:30 PM - 3:15 PM)

A. CWA Funding Initiative Subcommittee Update - Presentation of funding criteria and recommendation for Board direction. (Alan Leak & Sarah Klahn)



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The 2022 – 2028 CWA Budget Planning Workbook was reviewed and discussed. Cherry Creek Basin Water Quality Authority funding mechanisms and numbers were provided along with a State Park attendance graphic. Consultants asked for feedback from TAC on additional funding options for CWA. Raising the dues is the least labor intensive, but the amount anticipated to cover costs is high and could require up to 60% dues increase. There could be Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) support and there are possibilities for legislation. Legislation would be the most labor intensive and costly. There is additional potential cost to members not included in the forecast including regulations placed on facilities and upgrades to facilities to uphold limits.

Has there ever been a significant financial ask of CPW? They are not a paying member. CPW is an active member of the Cherry Creek Basin Water Quality Authority through appointment and CPW has voting privileges. How does CWA want the Authority structured financially with growing financial constraints? Does CWA have the resources within this consultant team to present the options going forward? CWA has an obligation to both Point Source and Nonpoint Source issues. Should CWA be involved in how TMAL is met, or let the members deal with this independently? Who covers the cost and what is the Authority's role?

Action: RESPEC and SSD prepare Action Memo outlining funding options with associated costs to include in the board meeting packet.
